

Horticulture Internship Summer 2023

Tudor Place Historic House & Garden seeks an intern to assist the Buildings, Gardens & Grounds team with horticultural maintenance of our 5 ½ acre site.

The Horticulture Intern will work with team members to care for the site. Primary responsibilities will be regular garden maintenance activities. This internship provides a unique opportunity to gain practical work experience and exposure to public horticulture. The intern will learn how to maintain a public display garden by working closely with staff and volunteers.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Assist with garden maintenance (including weeding, mulching, watering, raking, edging, deadheading,
- planting and pruning)
- Assist with care of nursery and greenhouse
- Assist in the rejuvenation of turfed areas

Qualifications:

- Must be a current student or recent graduate of horticulture, landscape design/architecture, or a related program
- Experience with implementing horticultural best practices in a landscape setting
- Knowledge of plant material and landscape maintenance techniques
- Strength, dexterity and mobility to perform all duties while working outside in all types of weather

Schedule & Logistics

- Two days (14 hours) per week with schedule flexibility; when seeking credit, the total number of hours is dependent on the credit requirements of the student's academic institution
- Approximate dates of the internship are mid-May 2023—August 2023
- Interns are eligible to receive staff Museum Shop discount
